

Common reflexive verbs in Spanish – a grammar exercise

Some verbs in Spanish are what we call reflexive verbs. This means that they take a reflexive pronoun (me, te, se, nos). Sometimes these are translated as ‘[verb] oneself’ but not always. For example, *me veo* means “I see myself”, but *me voy* means “I’m leaving.”

In the right column space below, practice writing out the conjugations of each of these verbs.
