

Task 4: Situations while traveling

Below are some real-world situations that you may encounter when traveling abroad. For this task, you and your classmate are to think of responses to say to each situation. Please *write* what you would say in each situation in Spanish complete sentences (or questions). Since you will be interacting with people and professional workers whom you do not know, it is best to be on the more formal side when interacting.

You can refer to your vocabulary handouts, consult dictionaries online, ask your teacher for help, and/or any other recourses that you need. Be creative! (Think about what you would really say and do in each situation). Be prepared to share written answers with the entire class when you are finished.

1. Situación 1:

You and your friends have arrived at the airport. You need to go to the check-in desk for your airline, but you don't know where it is located. You see a help desk. What could you say to the help desk agent?

2. Situación 2:

You find your airline check-in desk and go up to the counter. You need to check in. How do you greet the airline agent, and what do you say?

3. Situación 3:

You have checked in and you and your friends now have your tickets. You have to go to the gate. How do you thank the agent and then, ask where the gate is?

4. Situación 4:

Now ya'll are on the plane. You need a pillow, an extra blanket, some headphones, and a beverage. How do you politely ask the agent for these things? (Note: specify which drink you'd like. If you feel like adding pretzels to the list, you do you).

5. Situación 5:

You and your friends have arrived at the airport in the country you're visiting. You go to get your suitcases, and your suitcase unfortunately did not arrive. How can you find the baggage claim office? What can you say to the agent?

6. Situación 6:

Good news – your suitcase magically shows up. (¡Gracias a Dios!). You now need to go outside and get either a taxi or an uber. How do you ask where the taxis / uber pick-up area is?

7. Situación 7:

The country you are in does not permit uber, so taxi it is. However, *el taxista* is trying to charge ya'll \$50 USD. How do you if it's an officially recognized taxi? How do react and what do you say?

8. Situación 8:

You and your friends finally arrive to your hotel. First, introduce yourself and say that you have a reservation. Give your identification.

Second, ask the hotel agent how much a ticket is to the reguetón concert tonight, and if you can purchase the tickets with the hotel.
